OVERVIEW

Join us in Brazil for a unique opportunity to learn and work with the Mebêngôkre-Kayapó of A'Ukre and their network of NGOs, university, and government partners. Guided by an interdisciplinary team of Indigenous, Brazilian, and North American instructors, this program offers an experiential introduction to the issues, landscapes, and lifeways of the Mebêngôkre-Kayapó in the Brazilian Amazon. Located at the "arc of deforestation," the Kayapó manage, live in, and protect one of the largest, continuous tropical forest areas in the world.. This internship is a unique opportunity for participants to visit the A'Ukre community and the Pinkaiti Ecological Research Station to learn about life at the Amazonian frontier. The program is one of the only ways to visit the Kayapó Indigenous Territories.
